







ABM began the process to establish in-house maintenance in 1990, eliminating the need for outside contracting for the majority of its operation. The ABM maintenance crew maintains grass areas, trims over 2000 trees, grade washes, maintains irrigation systems, build and repairs masonry walls, roofing, welding, electrical, plumbing, graffiti and all general construction projects.

In 2023 we plan to begin the process of thinning out the native growth in our desert washes. These washes contain natural vegetation. The plant material has grown from seed. Included in our 2023 plan is the removal of trees growing near the flow line as well as trees that are too close to property walls. We will also be thinning selective shrubs that have become too woody or dense.

Another issue is the possibility of water restrictions this year. Arizona is losing 20% of the Colorado river water allotment. This may result in the government requiring cutbacks on landscape water use. ABM will do its part in conserving this most precious resource while trying to keep our plant material healthy.

ABM has a maintenance staff that reflects extensive tenure, experience and loyalty. They receive an on-going training curriculum to exceed industry standards. They are a dedicated team of individuals who maintain 106 acres of common property, amenities and office facilities. The team is very proud to service our wonderful Ahwatukee community.




#### **Arizona Wildflowers**

Vegetable Planting Calendar






