In an effort to control costs, ABM is pleased to announce that we are now offering email communications instead of the traditional postal mail.



### What does my assessment cover?

The annual assessment provides for just over 50% of the ABM's annual operating budget. The balance of the budget is comprised of administrative fees and user fees from the amenities. Ahwatukee's common areas include approximately 106 acres of greenbelt and desert channels requiring regular maintenance and upkeep for proper drainage and safety for homeowners. Our Community Center, private community park, RV Storage Park, swimming pool, tennis courts, community garden, and basketball courts also require full-time maintenance and business decisions. The ABM office and management staff oversee all amenities as well as processing all home sales transactions, performing CC&R enforcement, architectural requests, addressing homeowner to homeowner concerns, accounting, budgeting and legal matters.


